The GLLGI was formally organized in 1976 and is made up of members located in Michigan, other states and other countries. The group teaches and sponsors workshops in all types of lace. Members have demonstrated lace making at Michigan State Fair, Sauder Village in Ohio and numerous other public events.

Meetings are held six (6) times a year in Southeastern Michigan area. A newsletter is published every other month. The group also maintains a library that includes books, slides, videos and DVD's on all types of lace, lacemaking, lace history etc... These are available for borrowing by its members and by other lace groups.

Membership is open to any person interested in lace. Applicants must file an application for and pay the required dues. The GLLGI does not discriminate against anyone on the basis of race, sex, age, color, creed, religious affiliation, national or ethnic origin and previous condition of servitude or handicap.
